

NOTICE OF RACE

BBF SUMMER SERIES

Organizing Authority: Balboa Bay Fleet

1. RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in the current version of the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).
- 1.2 USCG-approved PFDs shall be worn at all times by competitors while on the water, other than brief periods while adding or removing clothing. The 'Y' flag will not be flown. This modifies RRS 40 and the preamble to Part 4.
- 1.3 Sabot A/B/C1 fleet boats may be subject to on-water equipment inspection upon the finish of each race. Refer to INSA class rules for a list of required equipment.
- 1.4 US Sailing Prescriptions 60, 62.3, and 63.4 will be deleted.

2. ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 2.1 To be eligible to sail, all competitors must be enrolled in a summer racing program at one of the yacht clubs, sailing centers, or youth sailing facilities in Balboa Harbor.
- 2.2 Each competitor is responsible for registering online prior to the first BBF event. Registration information can be found at balboabayfleet.weebly.com
- 2.3 The Entry Fee for each competitor is \$10.00 and covers the duration of the BBF Summer Series.

5. RACING VENUE AND COURSES

- 5.1 Venue 1: South Lido Channel
Venue 2: Turning Basin (Five Points)
Venue 3: "M" Mark
Venue 4: Balboa Pier (Ocean)
- 5.2 Approximate venue locations are shown in Attachment A.
- 5.3 The course may be a windward/leeward or any variation of a triangular or other course. Leeward gates may be used and will be designated by the Race Committee.
- 5.4 Course diagrams are shown in Attachment B.

6. SCORING

- 6.1 A low-point scoring system shall be used per Appendix A of the RRS.
- 6.2 Three (3) races are required to be completed to constitute a regatta.
- 6.3 When five (5) or fewer races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

7. DISCLAIMER

- 7.1 Sailing is an activity that has an inherent risk of damage or injury. Competitors in this race participate entirely at their own risk. See RRS 4, Decision to Race. The race organizers (Organizing Authority, Race Committee, Protest Committee, host club, sponsors, or any other organization or official) will not be responsible for damage to any boat or other property or the injury to any competitor, including death, sustained as a result of participation in this race. By participating in this race, each competitor agrees to release the race organizers from any and all liability associated with such competitor's participation in this event to the fullest extent permitted by law.
